



At this time Independence Presbyterian Church is planning on holding two Christmas Eve services this year. Both services will be in-person and live-streamed. Each service can hold up to 50 people in-person (25% of the sanctuary capacity) with COVID protocols in place. The Evening Circle is again coordinating Holiday donations to Family Promise, a Cleveland organization offering support for families in housing transition. Donation information is available on the bulletin board by the church office with gift suggestions including housewares, select gift cards, toys and pajamas for children, as well as holiday wrapping paper and gift bags. Donations accepted until December 6 in the blue bins in the back of the sanctuary.

The city of Independence has put out a request for bell ringers for the Salvation Army. COVID19 has had a damaging impact on the S.A. and volunteer participation is significantly lower this year. The specific day's they are requesting help are every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from November 27th through December 24. The shifts begin at 10am and end at 6pm and are assigned in 1 hour increments. The location is the Giant Eagle located at I-77 and Route 82. We are still collecting Pledge cards for our stewardship campaign. You can mail them back or if you would like to drop them off, there is a collection stand just inside the main door to the church. The office hours are Monday through Thursday 9am-12pm or you can bring it when you come to worship.


Daily Prayers for Advent Reflection: Week 1 November 29 – December 5

Sunday: God of justice and peace, from the heavens you rain down mercy and kindness, that all on earth may stand in awe and wonder before your marvelous deeds.

Monday: Raise our heads in expectation, that we may yearn for the coming day of the Lord and stand without blame before your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Tuesday: We seek the mighty God in the most unlikely places as a child in a stable, and in an empty tomb. May God hear these prayers, which come from the unlikely corners of our lives.

Wednesday: Give us ears to hear, O God, and eyes to watch, that we may know your presence in our midst during this holy season of joy as we anticipate the coming of Jesus Christ.



Thursday: Creator of the world, you are the potter, we are the clay, and you form us in your image.

Friday: Shape our spirits by Christ's transforming power, that as one people we may live out your compassion and justice, whole and sound in the realm of your peace.

Saturday: Open our eyes to Christ's presence in the shadows of our world, so that we, like him, may become beacons of your justice, and defenders of all for whom there is no room.
