Today's Worship: Service of Confirmation Tate McGovern & Ava Schmidt

The liturgy for today's service is based on what was studied in the Confirmation Class this year. The Confirmation Rite comes from the Rev. Dr. Veronica Goines and is based on both the Israelite river crossing and folk coming of age rites from Africa.

A big thank you to *Ryan Smith* and *Karen Shallcross* for serving as confirmation mentors.

Special thanks to Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple and St. Michael's Catholic Church for welcoming our class for worship this year.

About the Confirmation Gifts

During the service, the confirmands will be presented with three gifts, related to the confirmation curriculum. The first is a *Holy Bible*. The confirmands are "crossing over" into the adult life of the congregation. Today they receive an "adult" Bible, personalized with their name, as a reminder of this new stage of faith they are entering.

They also will receive a *towel / stole* with stitching that reads "*IPC Confirmation June 6, 2021.*" The symbolism of this gift is twofold: 1) it is presented as a reminder of their "river crossing" and the support they received along the way, and the support they will continue to receive on this side of the river. 2) It is a reminder of Christ's washing the feet of the disciples before the last supper. The towel/stole is a call to service; a symbol of the instruction that our faith must be lived, and that we are commanded to "love one another".

Lastly, they will receive a *stone cairn*. Like the Israelites who crossed the Jordan river carrying twelve stones, one for each tribe, so too the confirmands receive these stones as "a memorial forever" (Joshua 4:7) of their crossing over.

BIG GOD BIG QUESTIONS

CONFIRMATION FOR A GROWING FAITH

The word confirm, from the Latin confirmare, means "to strengthen." At Confirmation, the Holy Spirit and the church's prayers strengthen those who are being confirmed. Confirmation is a transition—a commencement, not a graduation. Confirmation is not meant as a crash course in Christianity, but an opportunity to welcome youth into an intentional time of discernment and conversations about faith, exploring the BIG Questions so that the confirmands can make a faithful response. ~ BIG God, BIG Questions, Teacher's Guide

The Confirmands followed a 12-Session Curriculum from PC(USA) titled *Big God, Big Questions*. Each lesson concentrated on one part of the questions the confirmands answer today as they become members of the congregation:

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you reject sin and evil and its power in the world? **I do.**

Who is your Lord and Savior? Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior.

Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love? I will, with God's help.

Will you devote yourself to the church's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers? I will, with God's help.
